SUPPORTED EMPLOYMENT

As part of our objective to assist adults with intellectual and other developmental disabilities achieve their full potential in the community, Advance Enterprises, in cooperation with local industry and community groups, develops employment opportunities in the competitive world of work.

Individuals and work teams, with support from a full-time job coach or supervisor, are employed by local companies in work settings ranging from food services to janitorial and grounds maintenance services.

SERVICES & SUPPORTS

Advance Enterprises is a Work Activity Program designed to provide vocational training for adults with moderate or mild intellectual disabilities. This program provides training opportunities in interpersonal relations, communication and work related skills that enhance the employability needed in the current labor market. In a factory setting through sub-contract work from regional businesses, individuals who use our services perform a variety of work activities, including packaging and assembly.

ENTRANCE TO THE PROGRAM

To be eligible for Advance Enterprises, an individual must be:

- Developmentally disabled with a primary diagnosis of mental retardation
- At least 18 years of age
- Free from behavioral and medical conditions which pose a hazard to self, others and/or association property
- Able to tolerate a 7-hour program day
- Able to administer to personal needs
- In addition, the individuals should be referred by the Inland Regional Center.
