The Arc Staffer named ‘Woman of Distinction’ by Assemblyman Emmerson

Riverside, CA – Assemblyman Bill Emmerson honored 63 women from his district with his Woman of Distinction award, an honor the Assemblyman established six years ago. Among the recipients is Jennifer O’Farrell, program coordinator for The Arc of Riverside County’s NineZero Project.

The award was presented by Assemblyman Emmerson on Friday, March 26th at the annual Women of Distinction luncheon. The event was held at the Doubletree Hotel in Ontario.

Each year, Assemblyman Emmerson selects just 63 women to receive the award. Recipients of the award reside in and serve communities throughout California’s 63rd district, which is made up of 11 cities throughout the Inland Empire. O’Farrell was selected for her many volunteer activities and her dedication to the community. In addition to raising awareness across the region of the dangers of drinking alcohol during pregnancy, which is the aim of the NineZero Project, O’Farrell sits on a number of boards and committees for organizations like the YWCA Riverside County, The Pick Group, and Riverside Mayor Ron Loveridge’s Green Action Plan Committee, among others.

O’Farrell is honored by the award, “I serve the community because I love the community and the people in it, and I am honored to be recognized,” said O’Farrell.

The Arc of Riverside County’s NineZero Project educates youth in their formative years, women in recovery, and women seeking prenatal care in order to shift the cultural use of alcohol consumption during the nine months of pregnancy. The project includes a peer-to-peer training curriculum called Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Teaching and Research Awareness Campaign (FASTRAC). In addition to providing occupational services and life skills training for adults with developmental disabilities, The Arc of Riverside County advocates on their behalf for dignity and respect.
